RE:	Recap of FSPAC 2024 Election Results

This memo is intended for sharing with donors and supporters of the Fraternity and Sorority Political Action Committee (FSPAC). It summarizes the success of the FSPAC's political contributions for the 2024 election cycle that concluded with last Tuesday's elections.

The FSPAC exists to build relationships with Members of Congress and amplify the benefits of the fraternal experience for students, alumnae/alumni, the campus community, and our nation. The FSPAC aids Members of Congress and candidates for federal office who support policies that will improve the fraternal experience for students. The FSPAC does not consider a candidate's political party or positions on issues outside our focus, and we help candidates who support our positions whether or not they are members of our organizations.

As we start the celebration of our 20th year of operation, the FSPAC enjoyed an outstanding fundraising and contribution record as we complete our 10th election cycle. The FSPAC has **raised more than \$900,000 in the 2023-24 election cycle**.

Key Election Highlights

- FSPAC provided <u>funding for 97 Senate and House candidates</u> this cycle, 90 of whom actually ran for office in 2024.
- <u>Members of 37 different fraternities (20) and sororities (17) received</u> <u>FSPAC funding</u> this cycle, as did a large number of non-Greek candidates.
- The FSPAC is bipartisan. <u>52% of our funds went to Republican</u> <u>candidates and 48% went to Democratic candidates.</u> The Greek composition of Congress is about 51% Republican and 49% Democratic in 2024.
- The FSPAC contributed to 38 female Senators, Representatives, and candidates in this cycle.

- The FSPAC's mission includes trying to help more Greek alumnae get elected to the House or Senate for the first time. Four (4) female candidates the FSPSC backed won their first election to Congress, and two (2) first-time female candidates FSPAC backed lost their election.
- <u>91% of FSPAC-supported federal candidates won election.</u> This includes:
 - 86% of all Senate races. The FSPAC funded 20 Senators and Senate candidates in the 2024 election cycle. 14 were up for election in 2024 and 12 won.
 - 75% of Senate Democratic races (6 of 8 races).
 - 100% of Senate Republican races (6 of 6 races).
 - o 92% of all House races (78 of 85 House candidates won their races).
 - 93% of House Democratic races (40 of 43 races).
 - 90% of House Republican races (38 of 42 races).
