SIGNED INTO LAW (12/23/24) STOP Campus Hazing Act H.R.5646

- STOP Campus Hazing Act passed UNANIMOUSLY in the House of Representatives on September 24
- (S.2901/H.R.5646) Promotes increased transparency and accountability regarding hazing incidents
- Senate passed after the November election.
- At state level, several states have moved forward with Anti-Hazing Coalition model legislation

FSPAC Fundraising – Where do the dollars go?

GENERAL FUND

- Only source for direct contributions to candidate campaigns
- Individual donations only; no organizational donations permitted
- Maximum donation limit of \$5,000 annually per donor

INDEPENDENT EXPENDITURE ACCOUNT

- No direct campaign support; research, polling, administration, etc.
- Individual and corporate donations
- No maximum donation limit

FEC REQUIRES FSPAC donors who give more than \$200 a year be publicly disclosed

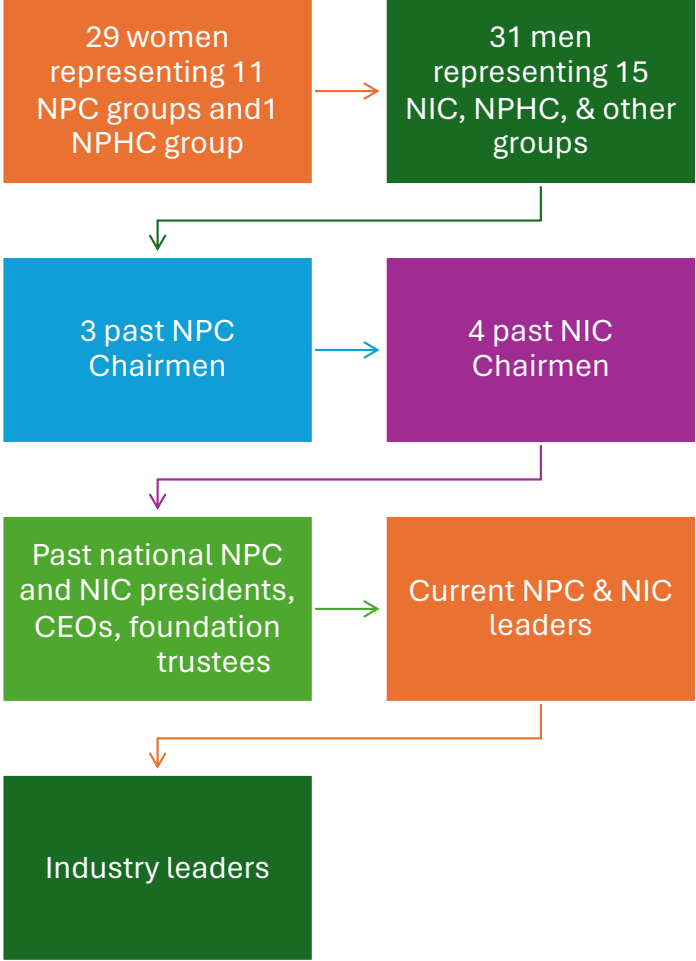

Fraternity and Sorority Action Fund



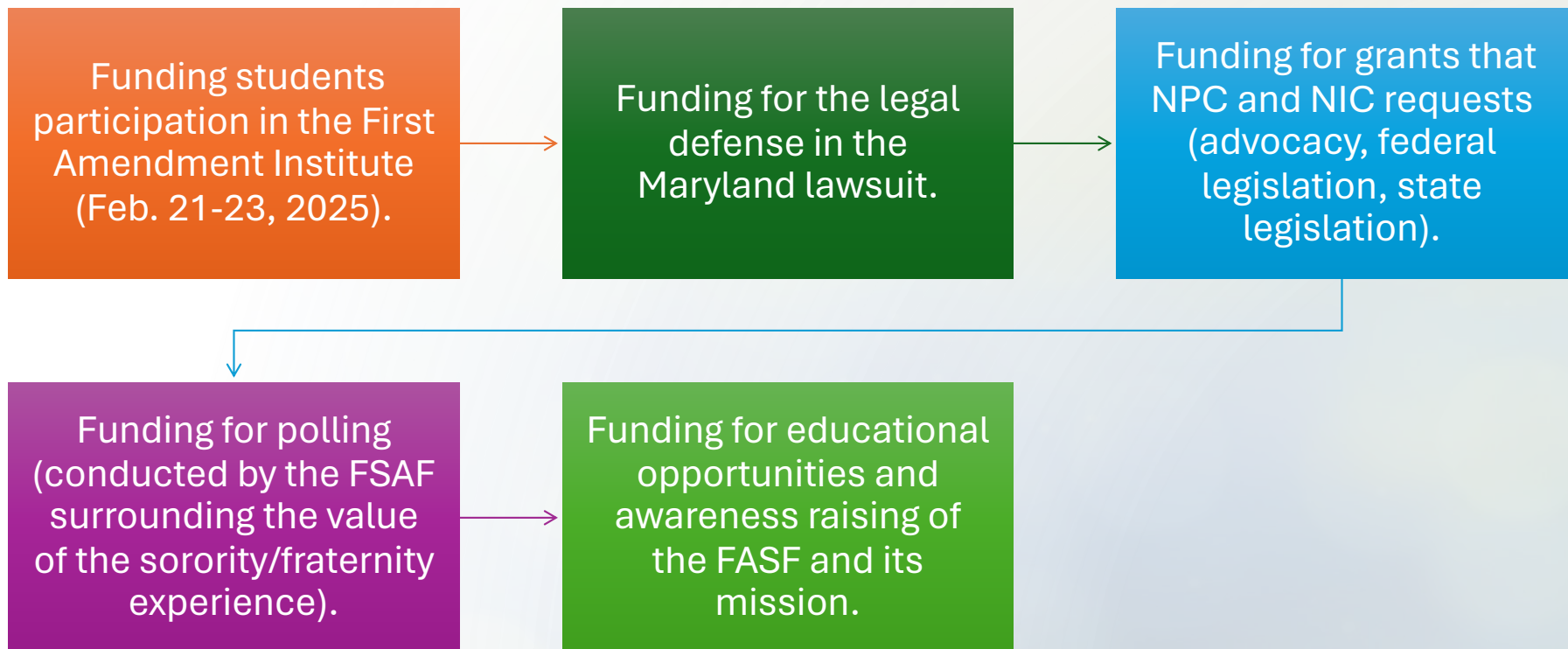
501(c)(4) – may accept unlimited personal and corporate contributions, and donors may be anonymous.

2025 FSAF PRIORITIES



FSAF Drives Many Fraternal Successes

Harvard – Federal litigation **WIN** demonstrating schools may not punish students for joining single-sex organizations.

Yale – Federal litigation **WIN** at trial and appellate court affirming fraternities may control their single-sex membership decisions and fraternal housing is not a place of public accommodation.

State Hazing Laws – Working across multiple states to strengthen criminal penalties and enhance transparency around hazing activities.

Local Zoning – Creating the long-term legal trail to allow fraternities/sororities to go unrecognized without losing their housing due to zoning regulations tied to official recognition.

Grassroots Advocacy – Funding tools for NPC and NIC to engage in multi-level advocacy and issue education with its members.
